### **ALUMNI PROFILE: IAN CROXFORD QC**



An Old Westcliffian (1964 to 1971), former School Captain (1969-70) and former Chair of Governors at Westcliff High School for Boys between 1995 and 2016, Ian obtained a Law degree from the University of Leicester with First Class Honours in 1974. He was

called to the Bar in 1976 by Gray's Inn and elected a Bencher in 2001. He was appointed as Queen's Counsel in 1993. He is a member of the Commercial, Chancery and Criminal Bar Associations and is currently a member of Wilberforce Chambers, one of the leading Chancery sets of Chambers in the UK.

He has been involved in many largescale and high-profile cases including in particular professional liability cases relating to claims against solicitors and accountants. In addition, he is regularly engaged in commercial disputes concerning not only the due performance of obligations, but also those where fraud is a component. The recent edition of Chambers & Partners 2016 notes that he is a vastly experienced Silk with a notable domestic and international workload. "He is technically excellent, very good at dealing with Judges and opponents, and very highly respected." "A superb court performer" who is "an excellent advocate and cross-examiner who masters his brief thoroughly."

A keen armchair sportsman (supporting both Saracens RFC and The Arsenal) he plays regular but bad golf. Ian lives in Rochford with his wife, Sandra. He continues his active involvement with WHSB as an Academy Trust Governor and member of the Old Westcliffian Association.

### **ALUMNI DONATION TO SCHOOL LIBRARY**



On Friday 11 November 2016 WHSB Alumni Professor Brian Hamnett, from the University of Essex (Department of History) visited the School to donate a large number of history books from his personal collection to the School Library.

Professor Hamnett attended Westcliff High School for Boys from 1954 to 1961; then Peterhouse, Cambridge to study History, from 1961 to 1964, and as a Research Student from 1964 to 1967. He received his Ph. D (Cantab) in 1968. He specialised in Late-Spanish Colonial History and taught at the State University of New York at Stony Brook as an Assistant Professor in Latin-American History from 1968-72, and at the University of Strathclyde from 1974. He moved to the University of Essex in 1990 and became a Professor in 1995. After retirement, he was made an Emeritus Professor.

He has published several books and articles on Latin-American and Spanish History, both in English and Spanish including three editions of A Concise History of Mexico (Cambridge University of Press) and has two new books coming out: The Enlightenment in Iberia and Ibero-America (University of Wales Press) and The End of Iberian Rule in Continental America, 1770-1830 (CUP, New York). He has been a member of the Royal Historical Society since 1986 and a Corresponding Member of the Mexican Academy of History since 1993.


We thank Professor Hamnett for his very generous donation and look forward to him returning to the School to provide a university-style tutorial session for some of our Sixth Form history students.

### WHSB CENTENARY: MEMORIES AND MEMORABILIA

Following our request in the first edition of the WHSB Alumni Network Newsletter, we would like to thank all those members of our Alumni Community who have made contact, sent us information, and visited the School to lend us their photographs and memorabilia. We hope to maintain this momentum as we are now accumulating a wealth of information and material to work with as this project progresses. Please do keep contacting us and we will keep you informed of our progress.

We would particularly like to thank local resident and Old Westcliffian Tony Le Masurier (1959 to 1966) who visited the School in October, bringing with him various photographs and



items of memorabilia relating to both his and his father John's time at the School. John Le Masurier, as an eleven year old boy, was one of the first pupils through the doors of the newly opened Westcliff High School for Boys in Kenilworth Gardens in September 1926. Born in 1915 in Aberdeen, John's family moved to Westcliff-on-Sea in 1919. Tony said his father could recall the houses being built along Kings Road in Westcliff, then a rough track, on his regular walk to and from School in the 1920s and 30s. John was a keen sportsman and he is included in a team photo of the First XI that played against an Essex County XI on 17th July 1933 that is displayed in School today on the wall outside the Headmaster's Office.

After leaving School in 1934, John pursued a career in photography and during WW2 served in Italy, as a photographer with the Royal Engineers, where he learned to speak Italian. Returning home in 1946, John joined Southend Council (then the County Borough of Southend-

on-Sea) to work in the Engineer's Department. During his time with the Department, John was responsible for creating a photographic record of Southend's post-war and subsequent development up until his retirement in 1980. Tony Le Masurier donated his father's extensive records of the wartime bombing of Southend to the local museum, and they were the subject of an exhibition there to commemorate the 60th anniversary of the end of the war in 2005. These records which charted the 700 or so pieces of ordnance which fell on our town, were saved by John, despite him being asked to dispose of them during the move to the new Civic Centre in the early 1960s.

John Le Masurier died in 2001. His family are now third generation Old Westcliffians, with his sons Tony and Terry, and grandsons Tim and Jonathan Dickens, following in John's footsteps.
